PURPOSE

To form a local government risk pool, to provide for a joint or cooperative action by members relative to their financial and administrative resources for the purpose of providing risk management services and risk-sharing facilities to the members and to the members' employees, and to defend and protect any member of the Pool against liability.

COMMITMENT

The Public Entities Pool of Ohio (PEP) was designed to offer Ohio public entities liability and property coverage at a fair and stable price. PEP has met this goal.

The PEP program is endorsed by the Ohio Municipal League, the Association of Ohio Health Commissioners, the Ohio Parks & Recreation Association and the Coalition of Ohio Regional Districts. PEP is the oldest public entity pool in Ohio with more than 570 members.

PEP was formed as a local government risk-sharing pool to provide risk management services, risk sharing facilities and protection for every Member of the Pool. PEP is owned by its members, provides a viable alternative to traditional insurance, and is committed to these goals.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Greetings, PEP members! The PEP Board of Directors, wants to thank you for your continued membership. As we close out 2020, and hopefully start closing the door on the COVID-19 pandemic, we would like to thank you for all you have done to serve your communities during the most trying year most of us can remember. We are so proud to have such high caliber members!

The COVID-19 pandemic presented many unique challenges and the members of PEP rose to the occasion!

- When COVID testing became a priority, PEP members set up drive-through testing sites and provided contact tracing.
- To ensure residents could maintain human interaction and learn along the way, PEP members offered virtual programming.
- Agricultural Societies hosted drive-through graduation ceremonies.
- Members posted new or updated park signage to reflect current COVID-19 information and protocols.
- Members updated their websites and Facebook pages to advise of testing sites, CDC recommendations and vaccination clinics.

These are just a few of the many proactive responses to challenges the pandemic has generated. The citizens of Ohio certainly appreciated all of this effort, creativity and hard work.

While the COVID-19 pandemic impacted how PEP Members serve their residents, it also impacted the many ways PEP serves its Members. I would like to take this opportunity to share some 2020 highlights.

EXPANDED SERVICES

In order to assist members with unexpected expenses due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the PEP+ Grant, which provides an opportunity for each member to receive up to \$1000 in grant funds, was expanded to include COVID-19 related expenses (i.e. personal protective equipment, disinfectants, protective gear and other items to assist with risk management efforts related to COVID-19).

NEW RESOURCES

PEP provided its members with relevant and timely risk control resources to assist members as they navigated the pandemic. Best practices, waivers, articles, assistance with grants, guidelines for reopening aquatic centers and for returning equipment to use after the shutdown were just some of the documents added to the Resource eLibrary.

Online training modules covering topics such as contact tracing, pandemic response, and return-to-work, were offered. On the human resources front, a number of federal laws were impacted by pandemic guidelines such as the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Family and Medical Leave Act; webinars, seminars, articles and best practices addressing these and other laws were made available to help guide members through these unprecedented times.

STRONG FINANCIAL POSITION

As you will see in the following pages of this report, PEP had another strong year financially and closed out 2020 with a net position of \$41,179,694, up from \$38,532,657 in 2019. We have you, our members, to thank for PEP's continued success.

In these challenging times and in the years to come, PEP will continue to deliver on its promise to provide customized coverage, relevant and topical training and educational resources as well as valuable member services. We look forward to serving you as, together, we continue to make PEP the premier risk sharing pool in Ohio. Be well.

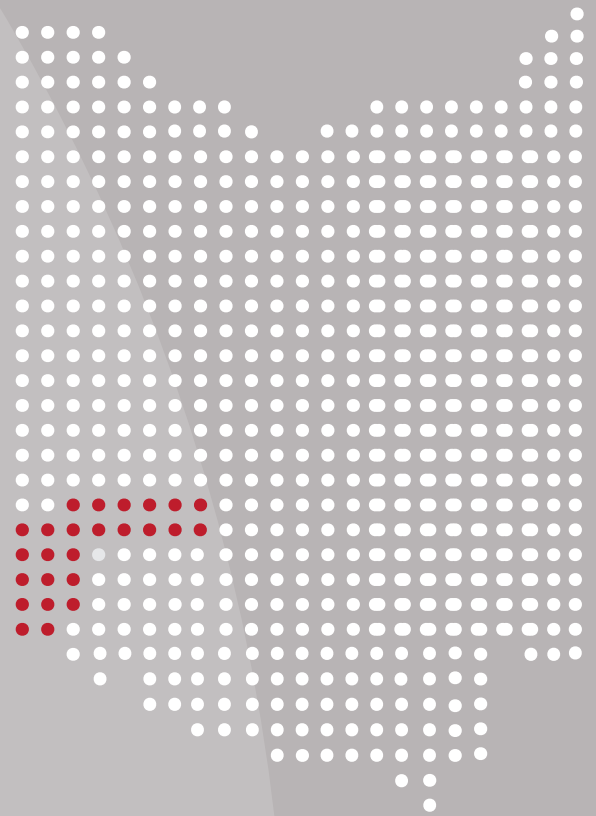

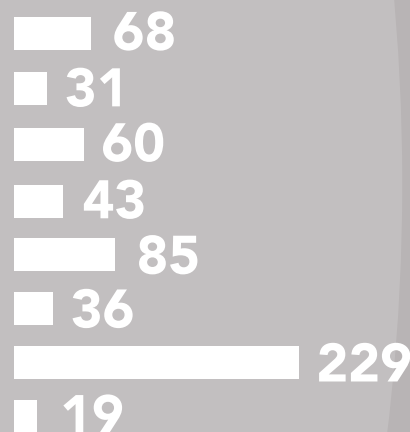

As the needs of PEP members continue to evolve, PEP responds in kind. By continually enhancing the services PEP provides its membership, PEP is able to offer its members the services and resources they need the most.

In order to assist members with unexpected expenses due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the PEP+ Grant was expanded to include COVID-19 related expenses. PEP also prepared to launch the 2021 PEP Police Academy, which will provide PEP members with relevant and topical monthly law enforcement policies and bimonthly law enforcement webinars. To further assist PEP members with their law enforcement needs, PEP expanded the parameters of the Legal Access Hotline to include the customization of the law enforcement policies provided by the PEP Police Academy. PEP prides itself on being responsive to the needs of its members. Enhancing, modifying and complementing resources and services are just some of the many ways PEP continues to serve its members.



CYBER RESOURCES

Justin Bailey, Risk Control Cyber Specialist, assists PEP members with understanding cyber breach vulnerabilities. Justin is a certified IT Auditor and Risk Management Specialist with over 20 years of experience in the industry. He visits interested PEP members and reviews their IT systems for any weaknesses that can be exploited. Members can schedule a security evaluation with Justin that will include a plan of action to help prevent cyber breach incidents. Justin will also inventory all member-owned equipment to ensure proper identification and coverage.

In addition to having a Risk Control Cyber Specialist, PEP members also have access to the PEP eRiskHub, a cyber portal that provides multiple individuals for each member access to the tools and resources to combat a data breach. Features of the eRisk Hub include:

BREACH RESPONSE – In the event of a cyber breach, our cyber breach claims team will promptly contain and resolve the breach.

INCIDENT RESPONSE PLANNING – Establishes information security policies and practices to ensure the uninterrupted security of sensitive information.

RISK MANAGEMENT TOOLS – Free resources, policy templates, state breach laws and risk self-assessments.

PEP+ GRANT

As part of PEP's loss control and risk management initiative, PEP members may apply for a grant of up to \$1,000. Grants are awarded to help offset qualifying expenses covering safety items that help prevent or reduce liability claims or property losses. In order to assist members with unexpected expenses due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2020, the PEP+ Grant was expanded to include COVID-19 related expenses (i.e. personal protective equipment, disinfectants, protective gear and other items to assist with risk management efforts related to COVID-19). PEP members access and complete the simple PEP+ Grant application right from the website at www.pepohio.org.

PROPERTY APPRAISALS

In order to ensure that member buildings are properly valued, PEP has partnered with a property appraisal firm, CBIZ Valuation Group LLC, to conduct appraisals on qualified and scheduled buildings over a five-year period. Program details include:


1. All buildings that were scheduled at \$100,000 or more were appraised.
2. If the member did not have a building scheduled at \$100,000 the building with the highest value was appraised.
3. Members received a copy of all appraisals.

PEP POLICE ACADEMY

The Public Entities Pool of Ohio continually strives to provide its members with the most relevant and useful resources. With that goal in mind, PEP is pleased to announce an entirely new law enforcement resource for 2021: The PEP Police Academy. The PEP Police Academy will provide PEP members with monthly law enforcement policies and bimonthly law enforcement webinars which can be viewed live or on-demand. These policies and webinars will be designed to direct law enforcement agencies toward optimal safety and professionalism.

LEGAL ACCESS

PEP members are eligible to receive up to 90 minutes of free legal consultation per year covering issues associated with human resources, zoning land use, open records/open meetings, and more. In 2021, PEP members will also be able to utilize the Legal Access Hotline to customize the monthly policies provided by the PEP Police Academy. RESOURCE ELIBRARY

The Public Entities Pool of Ohio prides itself on rapidly responding to members' needs. The COVID-19 pandemic presented PEP members with a number of unique challenges including navigating through a remote world, how to keep employees and citizens safe, employment liability implications, and carefully returning back to the workplace. PEP responded to these unique challenges by providing its members with pandemic-related resources aplenty: online training courses, documents, webinars, recorded seminars, and best practices and checklists, to name a few.

The PEP Risk Control Team authored approximately 30 documents that were placed in the Resource eLibrary including information on the Ohio CARES Act, COVID-19 Waivers and Releases for Ohio, Ohio FEMA Public Assistance Grants Program, Returning Idle Equipment to Service, and Safely Reopening.

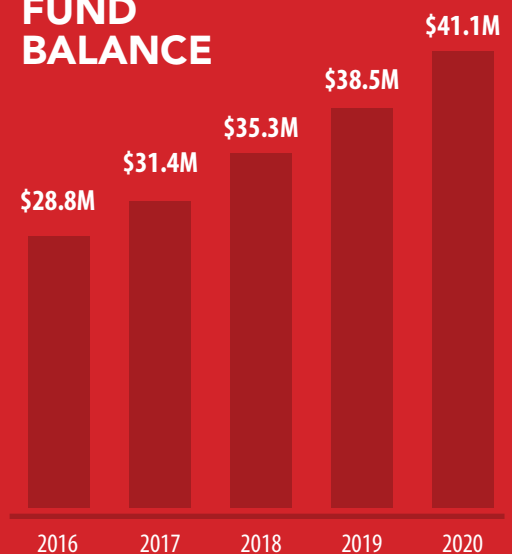
